### PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Eros Fiacconi

Welcome returning members and new members to the 2021-2022 Mississauga Camera Club year.

We begin this year, as we did this past year, in virtual mode. Tremendous strides have been made in the fight against Covid 19 and, in recent months, these have begun to greatly expand our opportunities. While our Club program is essentially set for this year, our approach has been to maintain flexibility in an effort to take advantage of these changing or improving circumstances. A case in point is the resumption of the Club "Outings" on Saturday, September 25<sup>th</sup>.

Any changes to the programming that may come about as things improve will be additive i.e. they will not come at the expense of the program that has already been established. These may include, for instance, in-person gatherings at the Club's facilities on Cawthra Rd. if/when they are opened by the City.

The Club Executive met on several occasions over the past few months, not only to prepare for the upcoming year, but also to address circumstances that have arisen and which may materially impact the operation of the Club.

Foremost among these was the imminent departure of a key member of the website team. Mark Fenton, who has been instrumental in overseeing many aspects of the Club website and related functions, has moved away. He has graciously offered to continue in this capacity and to assist in training new volunteers while the Club continues to operate virtually.

Through the efforts of various Club volunteers, in particular our Director of Competitions, Sandro Del Re, three Club members have agreed to step forward to help fill this gap. Meanwhile, the existing members of the website team and those of the competitions team and other related operations have offered to assume additional responsibilities to ensure that our website and functions/operations provided within the website will continue to run smoothly.

Thank you all so very much.

We expect the Club website to be updated in the next little while to reflect these and other personnel changes. I encourage you to visit the website to see who these individuals are and to thank them whenever you have the opportunity.

Among the many other issues and matters discussed and resolved at the meetings of the directors are the following two items which are not fundamental to Club operations but I believe may be of particular interest to members.

The first arises from the passing of long time Club member Claude Barras earlier this year. Claude's family approached the Club in the hopes of creating some sort of honorarium or award in his memory. After some debate, it was decided that Claude's memory would be honoured with a new trophy, provided by the family, to recognize excellence in "Street Photography" – an area of photography for which Claude had a passion.

The competition for this award will begin this year. The competition team has advised that competition #3 will feature "Street Photography" as the theme category. For this year, the winner will be determined based on the highest score achieved within that category. We encourage our members to get out there and begin taking photos to enter into this category.

The second item involves the introduction of a new component on the Club website recognizing the photography related accomplishments of our Club members outside the Club. We are well aware of the exceptional talents of many of our members and that their accomplishments in this field extend beyond those of our Club. Two recent examples of the sorts of things that would be highlighted in this section include: Sherry Prenevost receiving the 2021 MARTY award for visual arts from the Mississauga Arts Council and Stephen Balke having his article published in the Photographic Society of America Journal.

We encourage our members to provide us with such information on their achievements so that they may be highlighted on our website.

This year's annual general meeting (AGM) is scheduled to take place via Zoom on Thursday, October 21 at 7:00 PM. Over the next week or so, we will be sending out eblasts which contain important information relating to that meeting: documents such as this year's budget, last year's minutes and a proxy form for you to fill out in the event that you are not able to attend. Having said that, however, we urge all members to attend this very important meeting where, among other things, we shall be electing two new directors. And, you certainly don't want to miss the presentation which follows by our very own Mike Feraco titled "The Beauty of Photography".

And finally, I just want to thank the directors, in particular, Garry Weiler for ensuring that this season got off to a great start with the two inaugural meetings in September during my absence.

There is much that I have left out in this report and people who have not been acknowledged, but who are instrumental in the successful operation of this Club. This information will be forthcoming either through eblasts or presentations at our Club meetings and any changes to Club activities will ultimately find their way onto our Club website. So please visit it often.

Well, we've now entered the month of October, a month which is perhaps the most naturally colourful of the second half of the year. And, given the agreeable temperatures that come along with it, this is a great time to get out and capture the photos that will enhance not only your personal collection, but that will also form part of this year's competition.

#### **Competition Changes 2021 - 2022 Season**

The Competition Team is glad to announce a few changes for the upcoming competition season.

The Pictorial category will be split up. Each competition we have introduced a non-mandatory theme.

- o Competition #1 Landscape
- o Competition #2 Macro/Close Up
- o Competition #3 Urban/Street Photography
- o Competition #4 Flowers (as usual)

Note: The number of submissions per competition will remain at 3 per competition except for Competition 3 and 4 which will have 5 submissions.

The Advanced Level will be split into Advanced I and Advanced II. The Advanced II level will be comprised of Advanced members that have won a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or Honourable Mention recognition in 2020 / 2021.

The Advanced II will be dynamic in that if someone in Advanced II does not win anything then they will be moved back to Advanced I. This should be fun, and we hope to have more people submit images.

Note: All scores will still be accumulated in the Advanced level regardless of a member being in Advanced I or Advanced II. All trophy awards remain the same. There are no new trophies for Advanced II.

There are changes to the Creative category description. The new definition is as follows:

#### Creative Vision

Submitted images may be of any subject matter. They should display a change in natural colour, form, shape or any combination of all three. Any image modification process may be used to help create the final image (including but not limited to incamera processing and software such as Photoshop).

As in other categories, the impact, composition and overall technical excellence of the image are important. In this case, altered reality is expected to greatly contribute to the impact.

The subjects should be obtained by photography. Artwork or computer graphics generated by the entrant may be incorporated if the original photographic content predominates.

The Digital Competition Handbook will be updated soon to include this change.
