PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Eros Fiacconi

When we entered December last year, it had truly been my hope and belief that by now, we might be getting back to more normal operations, namely, the recommencement of inperson meetings. Unfortunately, that does not appear to be the case. Rather, what we are getting back to is merely a discussion of the plausibility of this happening.

With the passage of time, we have become more familiar and comfortable with Club functions taking place on line and via the Zoom platform. And, while we certainly miss the social benefits of in-person meetings and the Prints Competition, Zoom has allowed us to continue the majority of the Club's programming uninterrupted and has expanded the options available to members.

Given the foregoing and the evolving circumstances in which we find ourselves with the pandemic, we may need to seriously re-think how we see the Club operating next year and/or when things "normalize":

- Do we revert to our former arrangement of having 2 in-person Club meetings per month (if/when we are permitted to do so)?
- Do we consider having the two monthly meetings alternate, with one being inperson and the other via Zoom?
- Do we abandon our regular in-person meetings altogether and conduct all future Club meetings via Zoom and simply arrange for periodic in-person meetings throughout the year?

As you can imagine, the list of options is long with many variations. Each has its pros and cons. For the time being, we shall stay the course for the balance of this year and respond to opportunities as they arise.

In the meantime, I would kindly request that you each take some time over the next several weeks (as if you have nothing better to do during the upcoming holiday period) to ponder some of what's been raised above, in particular, how you would like to see the Club operate next year (2022-2023) and/or when things return to "normal". At a future Club meeting, most likely in the New Year, it is the intent of the Executive to conduct a poll to see where our members stand with respect to various options that will be put forward regarding this matter. Among others, this will help the Executive in its decisions regarding the booking of space at the Seniors' Centre.

On a less serious note, I am pleased to inform that the Directors approved having our Club subscribe to become a member of the Canadian Association for Photographic Art. Our next workshop is being presented by Doug Johnston on January 8, 2022

Join this workshop to explore how to use your editing software to adjust what you captured and create your best possible images. We will explore how to assess your image before making any adjustments, and then will apply the various tools available in your software to achieve exceptional results. To do this we will discuss approaches to removing distractions; cropping for composition; adjusting for tone; adding contrast; enhancing colours; eliminating noise; adding sharpening; and other opportunities to create an outstanding result.

The workshop is aimed at those who are starting their journey into editing or want to improve their understanding of the basic steps and tools, but others may find interesting tips and suggestions in the presentation.

The goal is that participants will leave with a understanding of basic photo editing approaches and tools.

The workshop will run on Zoom for about 2 ½ hours, with time to answer questions plus a couple of breaks. It will be primarily presentation style, using Lightroom software to demonstrate the editing. Other software has similar capabilities.

About your instructor: Doug Johnston has been interested in photography for many years, and is a long-time member of the club, having served as Program Director and President. The opportunity that the digital era opened for editing and adjusting photos after capture, even to achieve creative results, has been an ongoing journey of discovery. He continues this journey as the leader of the Photo Editing Special Interest Group.
