Gary is presently a freelance photographer and Getty Images contributing photographer working in the New York City area. He began his career as a news photographer working at United Press Canada from 1979 to 1985 in Toronto. In 1985 he switched to working for the Reuters News Agency and worked there in Toronto, Washington and New York until he left in 2014. Since leaving Reuters he has aimed his cameras on New York City working on a long term project photographing the ever changing skyline of New York and incorporating celestial events like sun and moon rises over the city along with weather related events like thunderstorms and snowstorms to help show off its beauty. In 2019 he published a book, "New York Celestial". New York is one of the top destinations and most photographed places in the world and Gary is trying his best to show off its distinct character.

Printing

In this workshop we will discuss the somewhat mysterious art of ink-jet printing as well as the processes and concepts involved from capture to print. We will touch on managing your captured image, how to 'properly' convert from RAW to something else, colour spaces, paper profiles, soft-proofing and to some degree sharpening and monitor calibration although those can be workshop topics of their own. We will combine all these concepts to size and prepare your file for the intended application/frame etc. Prepare to dig deep and learn new things!

About your instructor: Omar Sheikh has been (and continues to be) a student of the photographic world for the last 15+ years and uses his technical background to delve into getting the best results from any level of gear. Frustrated with the printed results of his work from commercial avenues, Omar decided to purchase his own equipment and learn the craft. He is now relied upon by many professional photographers to print critical images for personal use and commercial applications.


