# **COMPETITIONS - Sandro Del Re**

#### **New Category**

The Competition team analyzed more than 250 images that had been submitted in this year's competitions. The analysis revealed that our members take a significant amount of Landscape images. In the past these images would be entered in either Pictorial or Natural Things. This competition year we informed the judges and our members to submit landscape images in the Natural Things category. For the 2023/2024 competition year we are introducing a new additional category, **LANDSCAPES**.

#### Themes for 2023/2024

The competition team discussed the themes for next year and we decided that we would make the themes more of a photographic technique than a thing. Members can use the camera technique or simulate it using post processing. So for the 2023/2024 competition year the themes will be **Monochrome** for competition number one and **Silhouettes** for competition number two.

#### **Urgent Need for Volunteers**

The Competition team is in urgent need for a volunteer who is comfortable using EXCEL and can assist the team with use of Entry Wizard. Entry Wizard is the software that you are all familiar with as you use it to enter your competition images.

## **AV & SLIDE SHOW PRESENTATIONS - Jim Evans**

Four (4) new AV shows have been posted on the club's website under Member's Work > Audio-Visual Shows & Slide Shows. David and Karen Simmonds have created these shows with images from photography trips made with other MCC members over the past 20 years.

In their **Grand Manan Island** AV show, they reminisce about their 2003 visit to Grand Manan Island in the Bay of Fundy, just off the southern-most tip of New Brunswick. With fellow MCC members, they toured the island and had a fun-filled photography adventure. You'll be treated to idyllic images of fishing ports, sea-side villages, century homes and inns, lighthouses and island scenery. You will also see photos of seals, razorbills and the cute little puffins that inhabit the shoreline.

In June 2013, David and Karen, along with Peter and Janet Martin and Robbie Robinson flew to Whitehorse, Yukon. There they met Jean and Jeff Weller who had driven their camper from Ontario. Together they travelled to Dawson City, where the Klondike and Yukon Rivers meet, stopping at various places such as Miles Canyon, Carcross Desert, Kluane National Park, Haines Junction and Keno City to name a few. The rough Dempster highway was a challenge but they made it to Dawson City and also Tombstone Valley. David and Karen created two (2) AV shows of this amazing trip, one entitled **Yukon** and the other **Dawson City**.

And finally, in September 2016 David and Karen flew to Spokane, Washington with Robbie Robinson, Bruce Peters and Hilarie MacNeil-Smith to begin an exploration of the Palouse. The Palouse is a spectacular agricultural area in SE Washington near the Idaho border east of the Cascade Mountains. On this trip they were exposed to an endless variety of landscapes used to grow one of the largest lentil crops in the world. They managed to get to the top of Steptoe Butte plus a full day at the rodeo. All of this is nicely captured in their final AV show **The Palouse**. Enjoy sharing their memories!!

For those who might not be aware, there are now 18 AV Shows and 2 Slide Shows now posted on the MCC website, which in total, have received well over 800 viewings to date. The website has become our only medium for sharing our AV and slide show work since in-person meetings were suspended in spring 2020.
